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
Class 5

Lucy steps inside and finds herself in a strange, snowy wood. Inspired by this book we have created some wonderful pieces of writing from Lucy's viewpoint and detailed character

descriptions of the Queen of Narnia. We also created our own wardrobes with miniature coats and hangers, these included

moving mechanism which reveals the lamppost in Narnia.






Class 6
